Hispanic countries around the world have a variety of traditions, celebrations and foods they consume around December and Christmastime!

Below are a few examples for you to read about.



Las Posadas

Las Posadas, translated as 'inns' or 'lodges,' are related to the biblical story of Mary and Joseph looking for shelter in Bethlehem. In Mexico, families walk the streets singing these songs, 'posadas,' at doorsteps asking for a place to stay.

El Día de las Velitas
In Colombia on December 7th,
families commence the
Christmas season by lighting
candles, lanterns and lights in
homes, buildings and churches.

Twelve Grapes

In Spain on New Years Eve, people eat 12 grapes during the twelve clock strikes at midnight. If you eat them all in time, you are meant to have a year full of prosperity and good fortune.

Tamale

Tamales are a dish made with a paste of ground masa (a type of corn) and mixed with meat or vegetables, then wrapped with a corn husk or banana leaf. Sweet tamales can be filled with dried

Roscón de Reyes

This ring-shaped cake is often made for January 6th, Three King's Day (the Epiphany). It is meant to be in the shape of a crown to represent the wise men that visit baby Jesus on the Epiphany. It is a sweet bread filled and topped with dried fruit.

Polvorones



Polvorones, also known as Latin
American Christmas cookies or
wedding cookies, are soft, heavy
shortbread cookies. They are made
with lard and nuts (often almonds).
Many countries have their own twist
on this traditional cookie, but almost
all enjoy these cookies around
Christmastime.

At Coalbanks school, Santa's little helpers will make sure they make it to a family in need.




Thank you all for your help in making the Holiday Season at Coalbanks bright!
