
We are now accepting kindergarten registrations, Children must be 5 years old on, or before, December 31, 2024.

RINCÓN HISPANO/HISPANIC CORNER

Our Spanish Bilingual program has certainly grown a lot since its humble beginnings some seven years ago. Not only have we witnessed exponential growth in our Spanish student enrollment, but we have also seen the addition of some incredibly passionate teachers along the way. Sure, seven years can be considered a long time for some, but for those who have been here since the beginning, seven years doesn't seem like that much time at all.

The benefit of being one of the Spanish Bilingual elementary school programs in Alberta is the opportunity to collaborate with other Spanish Bilingual elementary schools in the province. For instance, in January, Señor Gentile took a handful of Spanish Bilingual teachers from Coalbanks to visit our sister-school, Collingwood Elementary School, in Calgary. Teachers from Coalbanks were given a tour of Collingwood by Señor Dornan, the principal, before Coalbanks teachers were paired with teachers from Collingwood to see how the Spanish Bilingual program is run on a grade-by-grade level basis. It was exciting to see that much of the same teaching and learning practices were seen being implemented at Collingwood are present here at Coalbanks! The trip to Collingwood was a tremendous experience, as well as an opportunity for teachers from both schools to meet and Collaborate with each other. This wasn't our first visit to Collingwood School, and it certainly won't be the last!
