#### Areas of success

When looking at our 3-year trends, we need to celebrate the areas of Citizenship and Education Quality, but there is always room for improvement. The challenge with such high results is the ability to maintain those results. That is why it is important to always look at three-year trends, rather than a one-year snapshot. This past year we did have a decline from the previous year when looking at the Education Quality, but still at 92.8 which is considerably higher than the provincial results.

- -Coalbanks is above the provincial average in these areas when considering the 3-year trends. We currently are at 85.2 for Citizenship and 96.2 for Quality Education which is exciting and something we are very proud of.
- -All 3 stakeholders (students, parents and staff) have indicated high levels in the areas of Education Quality, Student Learning Engagement, Citizenship, and Welcoming and Caring Environments, even though this one current year may be lower than previous years, we can still celebrate that we are above the provincial and division 3-year data.

#### Areas for growth

- -When schools are in the Very High or Excellent category, the challenge is to be able to maintain or increase in these areas. That is something that as a school community we will need to pay close attention to and ensure we are striving to meet these goals. We hope we can see following years increase when there may be a year where there is a slight decline.
- -The 2023 –2024 student data indicates that students view these results slightly lower than parents and staff. We may want to inquire throughout the year why this would be the case when staff and parents' results are considerably higher. This example could be in the area of Student Learning Engagement. Our students were quite a bit lower in this area than staff and parents. These results are considerably lower when looking at students results, and the difference is almost a 20-30% difference. This would be something we would need to investigate. Perhaps this is a question that we could pose during the Learning Bar Survey.
- -The other area of significant decline is in the area of Access to Supports and Services. The past few years supports in our schools have definitely been noticeable and we feel the results this past year have indicated that. Schools are trying to support the best they can, but supports have definitely dropped over the past few years due to the lack of funding in this area. Staff and parents have noticed this change.

#### **Evaluation**

- -Overall, we are above the provincial 3-year averages. Staff and parents scored our school quite high, but our students scored this area slightly lower than parents and teachers. However, our student score is still above the provincial average, but lower than staff and parents. The school will continue to implement strategies that promote and educate students around citizenship. Some examples of things we will continue to promote at Coalbanks:
- 1. Concepts of Character Education. Citizenship Outstanding Bravery Respect Academic, School Assemblies that promote these concepts/qualities.
- 2. Zones of Regulation.
- 3. School-wide understanding and acceptance of the Inclusion model.
- 4. Promoting student responsible for own actions and decision making.
- 5. Staff commitment to welcoming students daily at classroom doors and dismissing students daily outside.
- 6. Cobra Club which focuses on student leadership.
- 7. Grade 4/5 Lunchroom leaders.
- 8. School-wide focus of implementing the concept of the 'Golden Rule' treat others the way you wish to be treated.
- 9. School-wide recycling program and assisting with classroom clean-up daily to support our caretakers.

#### **Evaluation**

Overall, we are in line with the provincial average in this area. Parents and staff share a common perspective of a high level of satisfaction. However, our student results for this past year were lower than staff and parents and somewhat lower than the provincial average. This is consistent when looking at 3-year trends.

This can be attributed to some of the following factors:

- 1. Staff has a commitment to sound pedagogy (critical thinking, problem solving, authentic engagement, etc.).
- 2. Ongoing communication with families about our approach to learning and teaching (best practice).
- 3. Implementation of new curriculum in 3 of the 4 core subject areas (English Language Arts and Learning, Math, Science). New Social Studies curriculum will be introduced in the 2025-2026 schoolyear.
- 4. Implementation of the Universal Design for Learning within our school.
- 5. Professional Learning is always a focus on student engagement and what best practice looks like in our classrooms.

We should continue to strive for high quality teaching and setting high standards for all learners. When doing so, education and learning become the major priority.

#### **Evaluation**

Overall, we are above the provincial averages in this area. All stakeholders, parents, students and teachers, share a common perspective of a high level of satisfaction. We were above in all the areas for this past year. What has been interesting to reflect on is that our students rate the Education Quality very high, yet on Engagement they rank us quite low. Perhaps the students need to clearly understand what the section on Engagement is truly asking.

Similar to the above category, we feel the same factors contribute to these great results.

#### **Evaluation**

This past year, our staff have scored this section considerably lower than previous years. We feel it is because of the lack of supports provincially to help support our complex classrooms. The current funding model in our province does not support the complex classrooms we are facing every year. This is an area where we are slightly lower than the provincial averages. Providing parents with clarity regarding supports and services throughout the school may be helpful. Also, some parents who may never be aware of supports and services may struggle with answering this questions, where families that do access the various services are more comfortable to respond. Educators are being asked to do more in our classrooms with less supports than previous years.

#### **Evaluation**

To begin with, the data collected from parents is quite low. We only had 14 parents that completed the survey for a school of over 650 students (K-5). Parents have scored this area quite low, and it would be interesting to investigate this further. We have returned to regular events in our school community such as various clubs, co-curricular opportunities, parent volunteers, etc. and will continue to welcome parents to our school at appropriate times. Coalbanks will continue to work alongside our School Council to organize events and various opportunities for parents to become involved in their child's school. Each year we organize a year-end school community barbeque, which has been a huge success. We will continue to make this an annual event and make this a wonderful way of celebrating each school year.

For the past six years our attendance for parent/teacher interviews has been over 90% attendance by our parents, which is amazing. Our school functions, such as the year-end barbeque, Spanish events, choir performances, etc. has always been impeccable. We are unsure if our over-capacity issue at Coalbanks has played a part or not as some functions such as assemblies are limited to students and staff only due to fire regulations. This is something out of our control, but something to keep an eye on following the westside boundary review that will come into effect in the 2025-2026 school year. We also have an active and involved school council; however, for a school our size we are only averaging between 10-20 parents for our monthly meetings. This number could be higher for a school our size.

#### **Evaluation**

Overall, our results are higher than the provincial average. However, we need to focus on articulating the work we do in this area with parents. The overall trend regarding lifelong learning indicates that teachers have growing confidence in the impact of their instruction and over time parents have become more confident that their students are being taught the necessary skills for success in the future. At our monthly School Council meetings, we have started to show presentations for parents of the new curriculum and best practices for teaching and learning. We hope this may start to make parents aware of the new curriculum changes and how we approach teaching in our classrooms.
